To be admitted to Saint Vincent College, you must complete a minimum of 16 academic units of secondary school work. This should include four units of English, at least three units of college preparatory mathematics, one unit of laboratory science, three units of social science and two units of a foreign language among five elective units.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

When we review your application, our foremost consideration will be your academic potential. We'll look also at your extracurricular achievement – as well as information that will help us evaluate your character, motivation and promise.

Some things we take into account:

- Level and number of academic courses
- Grade-point average
- Class ranking (if available)
- Standardized test scores: SAT, ACT or CLT
- Personal essay and/or letters of recommendation (optional)
